A JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing to add Article VII, Section 21(J) of the Constitution of Louisiana,
relative to property taxation; to authorize the State Board of Commerce
and Industry to contract with developers of retirement communities for
the exemption of ad valorem taxes; to provide for submission of the
proposed amendment to the electors; and to provide for related matters.

Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of
the members elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted
to the electors of the state of Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the
manner provided by law, a proposal to add Article VII, Section 21(J) of the
Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows:

§21. Other Property Exemptions

Section 21.

* * *

(J) Notwithstanding any contrary provision of this Section, the
State Board of Commerce and Industry or its successor, with the

1 approval of the governor and the local governing authorities affected
 2 thereby, may enter into contracts for the exemption from parish,
 3 municipal, or special ad valorem taxes of developers of retirement
 4 communities on such terms and conditions which shall be as provided
 5 by law.

6 Section 2. Be it further resolved that this proposed amendment shall be
 7 submitted to the electors of the state of Louisiana at the statewide election to
 8 be held on November 5, 2002.

9 Section 3. Be it further resolved that on the official ballot to be used
 10 at said election there shall be printed a proposition, upon which the electors
 11 of the state shall be permitted to vote FOR or AGAINST, to amend the
 12 Constitution of Louisiana, which proposition shall read as follows:

13 Authorizes the State Board of Commerce and Industry to
 14 contract with developers of retirement communities for the
 15 exemption of ad valorem taxes. (Adds Article VII, Section
 16 21(J))
