5 fund ~~for any purpose:~~ only for the purposes of the minimum foundation
6 program.

7 (2) A law providing for the creation and operation of a state
8 lottery, once enacted, may be modified only by a law enacted by
9 two-thirds of the elected members of each house but may be repealed
10 in its entirety by a law enacted by a majority thereof. If such a law has
11 been repealed, the legislature thereafter may provide for the creation
12 and operation of a state lottery only by law enacted by two-thirds of the
13 elected members of each house.

14 (3) No state general funds may be expended for the primary
15 purpose of inducing persons to participate in the lottery. However,
16 state general funds may be expended for the purpose of reasonably
17 informing the public solely about the following factors pertaining to the
18 operation and administration of the lottery:

- 19 (a) The type or types of lottery to be conducted.
- 20 (b) The price or prices of tickets or shares in the lottery.
- 21 (c) The numbers and sizes of prizes.
- 22 (d) The approximate odds of winning.
- 23 (e) The manner of payment.
- 24 (f) Frequency and time of awarding of prizes.
- 25 (g) Location of sites for sale of tickets or shares and sites of
26 determination of winners and awarding of prizes.

Proposed constitutional amendment retains present constitution except requires annual appropriation of available monies in the Lottery Proceeds Fund solely for the purposes of the minimum foundation program.

Provides for submission of the proposed amendment to the voters at the gubernatorial primary election to be held in 2003.

Effective July 1, 2004.
