Subject: Workers' Compensation

WORKERS COMPENSATION

(Constitutional Amendment) Authorizes the Louisiana Workers' Compensation Corporation to participate in any plan, pool, association, guaranty fund, or insolvency fund

Proposed legislation is the enabling instrument for HB 493 and will be submitted to the electors of the state of Louisiana at the gubernatorial primary election to be held in 1999.

Present constitution (Art. XII, 8.1 (F)) prohibits the Louisiana Workers' Compensation Corporation from participating in or contributing financially to any plan, pool, association, or guaranty fund or insolvency fund.

Proposed constitutional amendment retains present constitution but authorizes such participation or contributions upon the extinguishment of the full faith and credit guarantee of the state.

Louisiana Workers' Compensation Corporation (LWCC) does not have any involvement in state employees' worker

EXPLANATION OF ESTIMATES:

EXPENDITURES:

Proposed legislation would have no effect on potential state expenditures. This legislation would allow for the participation in any plan, pool, association, or guaranty or insolvency fund upon extinguishment of the full faith and credit guarantee of the state.

Local government may be effected by LWCC participation in any plan, pool, association, or guaranty or insolvency fund. There are some local government entities that may have workers' compensation coverage through LWCC.

Under current state statute, the full faith and credit guarantee of the state of Louisiana shall expire at the time that the United States Department of Labor approves the provision of coverage for longshoremen and harbor workers by the corporation without the state's full faith and credit guarantee.
