Subject: Posting Notification of Speed Cameras

Requires posting notification of speed camera location. (8/1/17)

Purpose of Bill: This measure requires local municipal and parish authorities to post signs indicating that a mobile or fixed location speed camera is present within five hundred feet of each speed camera.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There may be a small increase in local government expenditures of municipalities or parishes that would need to purchase signs as a result of this measure.

According to information from the Louisiana Municipal Association and the Police Jury Association, there are less than 10 communities in the state that have speed cameras and the cost for each new sign would be approximately \$40-\$50.

According to officials with the City of New Orleans, there would be no cost as they already have signs posted that are in compliance with the provisions of this measure.

According to officials with the Lafayette Consolidated Government, they already have signs posted for fixed location speed cameras and the cost would be minimal to post signs for the mobile units.

According to officials with the City of Gretna, the cost would be approximately \$2,000 to purchase signs for their speed cameras.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.

According to officials with the City of New Orleans, Lafayette Consolidated Government, and City of Gretna, no material impact on revenues is expected as a result of posting notification of speed camera locations.
