

## RÉSUMÉ DIGEST

ACT 282 (HB 607)

2020 Regular Session

Existing law prohibits a minor from being issued a driver's license or learner's permit for the operation of a motor vehicle unless, at the time of the application, documentation of required school attendance is presented to demonstrate that the minor has:

- (1) Received a high school diploma or a high school equivalency diploma.
- (2) Enrolled in and is attending a school.
- (3) Enrolled in and is attending a course leading to a high school equivalency diploma.
- (4) Completed the required minimum units of credit for high school graduation and all other graduation requirements as mandated by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, but has failed to pass the high school graduation exit exam.
- (5) Received a special education certificate of achievement certifying the student has completed high school.
- (6) Enrolled in and is participating in a home school program.
- (7) Requested and received a decision by the appropriate authority that the minor is unable to attend any school or program due to circumstances beyond the control of the minor and deemed acceptable.

Existing law requires the appropriate authority to provide documentation of compliance with the school attendance requirements upon the request of any minor enrolled and attending school and eligible to apply for a license.

Existing law requires the minor to present documentation of their compliance with the school attendance requirements upon application or renewal of a driver's permit or license.

New law modifies existing law to include a temporary instruction permit and a learner's permit. New law modifies existing law to allow a minor's parents or legal guardians to present documentation of the minor's compliance with the school attendance requirements upon application or renewal of a driver's permit or license.

Prior law required the minor's compliance with the school attendance requirements for a driver's license or permit be provided on a form developed by the Dept. of Education and made available to all school boards, home school providers, and adult education supervisors upon the request of the Dept. of Education.

New law repeals prior law and instead requires the minor's compliance with the school attendance requirements for a driver's license or permit be provided on a signed statement to the department attesting the applicant has complied with the school attendance requirements. Requires that the documentation be provided by a parent or guardian of a 17 year old first time applicant for a Class "E" license. Specifies that if the first time applicant for a Class "E" license is 17 years of age and emancipated, the applicant must provide the attestation for himself, provided that the applicant has proof of the emancipation and the necessary identifying information and documents.

Effective Aug. 1, 2020.
