STATE SYMBOL: Designates mayhaw and Louisiana sugar cane jellies as
the official state jellies

1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 49:170.8, relative to state symbols; to provide that mayhaw jelly
3 and cane jelly are the official state jellies of Louisiana; and to provide
4 for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 49:170.8 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

7 §170.8. State jellies

8 A. There shall be two official state jellies. One official state
9 jelly shall be the mayhaw jelly. Its use on official documents of the
10 state and with the insignia of the state is hereby authorized.

11 B. The second official state jelly shall be Louisiana sugar cane
12 jelly. Its use on official documents of the state and with the insignia of
13 the state is hereby authorized.
