



1           WHEREAS, many powers assumed by the federal government as well as federal  
2 mandates are in direct violation of the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United  
3 States of America; and

4           WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court has ruled in New York v. United  
5 States, 112 S.Ct. 2408 (1992), that Congress may not simply commandeer the legislative and  
6 regulatory processes of the states; and

7           WHEREAS, a number of proposals from previous administrations and some pending  
8 with the present administration as well as from Congress may further violate the Constitution  
9 of the United States of America.

10          THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana memorializes  
11 the Congress of the United States of America that the legislature affirms Louisiana's  
12 sovereignty under the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States of America  
13 over all powers not otherwise enumerated and granted to the federal government by the  
14 Constitution of the United States of America.

15          BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana also demands that  
16 the federal government halt and reverse its practice of assuming powers and imposing  
17 mandates upon the states for purposes not enumerated by the Constitution of the United  
18 States of America.

19          BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution shall be transmitted  
20 to the secretary of the United States Senate and the clerk of the United States House of  
21 Representatives and to each member of the Louisiana delegation to the United States  
22 Congress and to the president of the United States of America and to the governor of  
23 Louisiana.
