HOUSE BILL NO. 647

DISTRICTS/SPECIAL: Authorizes the governing authority of Lincoln Parish to create the Lincoln Parish G.I.S. District

1 AN ACT

2 To enact Subpart B-42 of Part IV of Chapter 1 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes
3 of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 33:130.791 through 130.797, relative to Lincoln
4 Parish; to authorize the governing authority of the parish to create a geographic
5 information system district; to provide relative to the board of commissioners for the
6 district; to provide for the powers, duties, and functions of the district; to authorize
7 the board to levy certain taxes; and to provide for related matters.

8 Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published
9 as provided by Article III, Section 13 of the Constitution of
10 Louisiana.

11 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

12 Section 1. Subpart B-42 of Part IV of Chapter 1 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised
13 Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 33:130.791 through 130.797, is hereby enacted to read
14 as follows:

15 SUBPART B-42. LINCOLN PARISH

16 GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEM DISTRICT

17 §130.791. Creation; purpose; boundaries

18 A.(1) The governing authority of Lincoln Parish may create and establish a
19 body politic and corporate entity for the purpose of the development and application
20 of geographic information systems, including but not limited to base data regarding

1 property ownership, population, demographics, political boundaries, emergency
2 service areas, land use, streets, addresses, roads, bridges, utilities, easements,
3 servitudes, rights-of-way, topography, subdivisions, flood plains, and subdivision
4 restrictions.

5 (2) If created and established pursuant to this Section, the district shall be a
6 political subdivision of the state of Louisiana, as defined in Article VI, Section 44
7 of the Constitution of Louisiana, and shall be known as the Lincoln Parish
8 Geographic Information System District, referred to in this Subpart as the "district".

9 (3) The district may also assist with homeland security and emergency
10 preparedness as well as the technical aspects and support of the various computer
11 systems of political subdivisions and other public entities within Lincoln Parish,
12 including but not limited to advice and support on any hardware, software,
13 networking, or other such information technology issues.

14 (4) No other provision of this Subpart shall be effective or operative unless
15 the district is created and established by the Lincoln Parish Police Jury pursuant to
16 this Section.

17 B. The boundaries of the district shall be coterminous with the boundaries
18 of Lincoln Parish.

19 §130.792. Board of commissioners; membership

20 A.(1) The district shall be governed by a board of commissioners, referred
21 to in this Subpart as the "board", consisting of members as provided in this
22 Subsection.

23 (2) The following shall be members of the board:

24 (a) The assessor of Lincoln Parish or the assessor's designee.

25 (b) One member appointed by the governing authority of Lincoln Parish.

26 (c) One member appointed by the governing authority of Ruston.

27 (d) One member appointed by the governing authority of the Lincoln Parish
28 Communications District.

29 (e) The sheriff of Lincoln Parish or the sheriff's designee.

1 (f) One member appointed by the governing authority of the Lincoln Parish
2 Fire Protection District.

3 (g) The clerk of court of Lincoln Parish or the clerk's designee.

4 (3) The governing authority of Lincoln Parish may add up to four additional
5 members of the board. Each such additional member shall represent a political
6 subdivision or other entity with an interest in the purpose of the district, and only one
7 member may be appointed to represent any particular subdivision or entity. The
8 parish governing authority may establish criteria that a subdivision or entity must
9 meet in order to have a representative on the board.

10 B.(1) Board members shall serve four-year terms after initial terms as
11 provided for in Paragraph (2) of this Subsection.

12 (2) Two members shall serve an initial term of one year; two members shall
13 serve an initial term of two years; two members shall serve an initial term of three
14 years; and one member shall serve an initial term of four years, all as determined by
15 lot at the first meeting of the board.

16 C. Any vacancy which occurs prior to the expiration of the term for which
17 a member of the board has been appointed shall be filled for the remainder of the
18 unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.

19 D. Members shall be eligible for reappointment.

20 E. The members of the board shall serve without compensation.

21 §130.793. Board officers; meetings; quorum; rules; report

22 A. The board shall elect from its members a chair, a vice chair, a secretary,
23 and a treasurer. The board may combine such offices or elect other officers as it may
24 deem necessary.

25 B. The board shall keep minutes of all meetings and shall make them
26 available through the secretary of the board to residents of the district. The minute
27 books and archives of the district shall be maintained by the secretary of the board.
28 The monies, funds, and accounts of the district shall be in the official custody of the
29 board.

1 C. The board may adopt bylaws or such other rules and regulations as it
2 deems necessary or advisable for conducting its business affairs.

3 D. The board shall hold regular meetings at least quarterly and may hold
4 special meetings at such times and places within the district as may be prescribed by
5 the board.

6 E. A majority of the members of the board shall constitute a quorum for the
7 transaction of business.

8 §130.794. Powers and duties

9 A. The district shall have and exercise all powers of a political subdivision
10 necessary or convenient for the purpose of funding the district and carrying out its
11 objects and purposes, including but not limited to the following:

12 (1) To incur debt.

13 (2) To sue and be sued.

14 (3) To adopt, use, and alter at will a corporate seal.

15 (4) To adopt bylaws and rules and regulations.

16 (5) To receive by gift, grant, donation, or otherwise any sum of money,
17 property, aid, or assistance from the United States, the state of Louisiana, or any
18 political subdivision thereof, or any person, firm, or corporation.

19 (6) To enter into contracts, agreements, or cooperative endeavors with the
20 state and its political subdivisions or political corporations and with any public or
21 private association, corporation, business entity, or individual.

22 (7) To elect officers and appoint agents and employees, prescribe their
23 duties, and fix their compensation.

24 (8) To acquire property by purchase, gift, grant, donation, lease, or
25 otherwise.

26 (9) To establish monetary, bank, and investment accounts.

27 (10) To establish committees or subcommittees.

28 (B) The district shall not be deemed to be an instrumentality of the state for
29 purposes of Article X, Section 1(A) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

1 §130.795. Funding sources; ad valorem tax; sales and use tax

2 A. The board may levy annually and cause to be collected an ad valorem tax,
3 provided that the amount, term, and purpose of such tax, as set out in a proposition
4 submitted to a vote in accordance with the Louisiana Election Code, shall be
5 approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting on the proposition at an
6 election held for that purpose.

7 B.(1) The board may levy and collect a sales and use tax within the
8 boundaries of the district for such purposes and at such rate as provided by the
9 proposition authorizing its levy, not exceeding one percent, which tax may exceed
10 the limitation set forth in Article VI, Section 29(A) of the Constitution of Louisiana,
11 provided the proposition submitted to a vote in accordance with the Louisiana
12 Election Code, shall be approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting on the
13 proposition at an election held for that purpose.

14 (2) The tax shall be levied upon the sale at retail, the use, the lease or rental,
15 the consumption, the distribution, and storage for use or consumption of tangible
16 personal property, and upon the sales of services within the district, all in accordance
17 with Chapter 2-D of Subtitle II of Title 47 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950.

18 (3) Except where inapplicable, the procedure established in Chapter 2-D of
19 Subtitle II of Title 47 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 shall be followed in
20 the imposition, collection, and enforcement of the tax, and procedural details
21 necessary to supplement such provisions and to make them applicable to the tax
22 authorized by this Subsection shall be fixed in the ordinance imposing the tax.

23 §130.796. Budget.

24 A. The board shall adopt an annual budget in accordance with the Local
25 Government Budget Act, R.S. 39:1301, et seq.

26 B. The district shall be subject to audit by the legislative auditor pursuant to
27 R.S. 24:513.

1 §130.797. Lincoln Parish information technology
2 If the governing authority of Lincoln Parish creates a district as authorized
3 by this Subpart, it shall provide for the transfer of all duties, obligations, property,
4 and employees of the Lincoln Parish Information Technology Department or the
5 successor of that department and any parish agency responsible for geographic
6 information systems to the district.

7 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
8 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
9 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
10 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
11 effective on the day following such approval.

Abstract: Authorizes the governing authority of Lincoln Parish to create a geographic information system district.

Proposed law authorizes the governing authority of Lincoln Parish to create and establish, as a political subdivision, a geographic information system district for the development and application of information systems. Provides relative to district boundaries and the membership, terms, meetings, and powers and duties of the district's board of commissioners. Provides for a seven-member board comprised of specified ex officio members and appointees of specified political subdivisions in the parish. Authorizes the parish governing authority to provide for up to four additional members representing other political subdivisions or entities. Authorizes the board to levy annually an ad valorem tax and to levy and collect a sales and use tax, not to exceed 1%, all subject to voter approval. Requires the board to adopt an annual budget and provides that the district shall be subject to audit by the legislative auditor. Provides that the district, if created, shall succeed the Lincoln Parish Information Technology Department and the Lincoln Parish agency responsible for geographic information systems.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
