PRESCRIPTION. Increases the prescriptive period for certain actions for harvesting and sale of timber. (8/15/09)

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact Civil Code Article 3497, and to enact R.S. 3:4278.1(G) and
3	4278.2(G), relative to liberative prescription; to increase the prescriptive period for
4	an action for damages for the harvesting of timber without the consent of the owner;
5	to provide relative to an action for damages caused by the harvesting and sale of
6	timber without the consent of the owner; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. Civil Code Article 3497 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as
9	follows:
10	Art. 3497. Actions subject to a five year prescription
11	The following actions are subject to a liberative prescription of five years:
12	An action for annulment of a testament;
13	An action for the reduction of an excessive donation; and
14	An action for the rescission of a partition and warranty of portions: ; and
15	An action for damages caused by the harvesting of timber without the
16	consent of the owner.
17	This prescription is suspended in favor of minors, during minority.

1 Section 2. R.S. 3:4278.1(G) and 4278.2(G) are hereby enacted to read as follows: 2 §4278.1. Trees, cutting without consent; penalty 3 G. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a civil 4 5 action pursuant to provisions of this Section shall be subject to a liberative prescriptive period of five years. 6 7 §4278.2. Sale of undivided timber interest; consent of co-owners; theft 8 9 G. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a civil 10 action pursuant to provisions of this Section shall be subject to a liberative 11 prescriptive period of five years. DIGEST

Kostelka (SB 60)

<u>Present law</u> provides that a liberative prescription of 5 years is applicable to an action for annulment of a testament, an action for the reduction of an excessive donation, and an action for the rescission of a partition and warranty of portions. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>, and adds to list an action for damages caused by the harvesting of timber without the consent of the owner.

<u>Present law</u> provides civil and criminal penalties for the cutting of trees without the consent of the owner or legal possessor. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds that a civil action pursuant to the <u>present law</u> is subject to a liberative prescriptive period of 5 years.

<u>Present law</u> provides certain requirements for the sale and removal of timber from lands with co-owners or co-heirs. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds that a civil action pursuant to the <u>present law</u> is subject to a liberative prescriptive period of 5 years.
