7 **rebutted if the obligor demonstrates"**

9 On page 2, delete lines 5 through 7 and insert

10 **"or salary. There shall be a presumption that such payments are income of the**
11 **obligor, which may be rebutted if the obligor demonstrates there is a history of**
12 **payments preceding the separation of the parties or the filing of an action to**
13 **establish or modify child support, or that the payments are fair"**

14 AMENDMENT NO. 4

15 On page 2, delete lines 11 and 12 and insert

16 **"the business of the obligor. There shall be a presumption that past distributions**
17 **of income will continue, which may be rebutted if the obligor demonstrates**
18 **business conditions justify a reduction in"**

19 AMENDMENT NO. 5

20 On page 3, line 25, delete "may" and insert "shall"
