

Provides for the establishment, deposits, and transfers among funds in the state treasury.

Existing law, relative to the Budget Stabilization Fund, provides that mineral revenue in excess of \$850 million and 25% of revenues designated as nonrecurring shall be deposited into the Budget Stabilization Fund. Further authorizes the legislature to deposit nonrecurring revenues into the Budget Stabilization Fund. Provides that no appropriation or deposit shall be made into the fund if such appropriation or deposit would cause the balance of the fund to exceed 4% of the total state revenues (excluding monies from FEMA or other federal disaster relief) of the previous fiscal year.

New law retains existing law, but provides that no appropriation or deposit shall be made into the Budget Stabilization Fund in the same year that an appropriation, use, or withdrawal is made from the fund, except pursuant to a specific legislative appropriation or until the official forecast exceeds state general fund collections for FY 2008.

New law establishes the Hurricane Recovery Health Insurance Premium Fund as a special treasury fund. Provides that the source of funding shall be any monies appropriated annually by the legislature including donations, gifts, grants, or as provided by law. Provides that monies in the fund shall be distributed as follows: 63.3% to the Orleans Parish School Board to reduce the employee portions of health insurance premiums of certain system retirees; 4.9% to the Cameron Parish School Board to subsidize health insurance premiums; 10.4 % to Plaquemines Parish School Board to subsidize health insurance premiums; and 21.4% to St. Bernard Parish School Board to subsidize health insurance premiums.

New law establishes the Center for Excellence for Autism Spectrum Disorder Fund as a special treasury fund. Provides that the source of funding shall be any monies appropriated annually by the legislature including donations, gifts, grants, or as provided by law. Provides that monies in the fund shall be appropriated and used solely to pay costs and expenses associated with the establishment and operation of a center of excellence for autism spectrum disorder by the Dept. of Health and Hospitals, office for citizens with developmental disabilities.

New law establishes the Walking the Walk for Our Kids Fund as a special treasury fund. Provides that the source of funding shall be any monies appropriated annually by the legislature including donations, gifts, grants, or as provided by law. Provides that monies in the fund shall be appropriated and used solely for the diagnosis, prevention, and treatment of childhood obesity.

New law establishes the Technology Commercialization Fund as a special treasury fund. Provides that monies shall be transferred into the fund subject to legislative appropriation. Provides that monies in the fund shall be used by the La. Economic Development Corporation to provide for a competitive grants program for the advancement of commercialization of technologies developed at La. institutions of higher education and academic research centers. Provides for the establishment of a committee for the review and consideration of grants proposals comprised of representatives of the public and private sectors, of which a majority shall be from the private sector.

New law establishes the Statewide Education Facilities Fund as a special treasury fund. Provides that the source of funding shall be any monies appropriated annually by the legislature including federal monies, donations, gifts, grants, or as provided by law. Provides that monies in the fund shall be appropriated and used solely for the purposes of the Statewide Education Facilities Authority.

Existing law provides for the allocation of monies in the Vermilion Parish Visitor Enterprise Fund, which is comprised of monies from the collection of state sales tax on hotel occupancy in Vermilion Parish.

New law adds the village of Maurice for the Maurice Historical Preservation Society to the list of recipients of the allocation of monies under existing law.

Prior law established the Insure La. Incentive Program Fund in the state treasury. Provided that monies in the fund were to be appropriated and used solely and exclusively to make matching capital fund grants as provided by law. The fund consisted of monies equal to the total amount of the tax credits, deductions, or rebates to individuals in La. enacted during

the 2007 R.S., not to exceed the sum of \$100 million. At such time as the commissioner of insurance had finalized all of the grants authorized, the fund was to be abolished and any remaining unexpended and unencumbered balances would revert to the state general fund.

New law repeals prior law. Further abolishes the fund and transfers any unexpended, unencumbered monies in the fund for deposit in and credit to the state general fund.

Authorizes and directs the state treasurer to deposit \$3.9 million into the state general fund from the Incentive Fund.

Transfers monies to the state general fund from various fund appropriations reduced in the Deficit Reduction Plan approved by the governor by executive order and by action of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget on Jan. 9, 2009. Authorizes the transfer of \$24,378,056 to the state general fund in the following amounts from the following funds:

Authorizes and directs the state treasurer to deposit \$404,308 into the Overcollections Fund from the La. Technology Innovations Fund, notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary.

Authorizes and directs the state treasurer to deposit \$315,500,000 into the La. Medical Assistance Trust Fund from FY 2008-2009 state general fund receipts.

Authorizes and directs the state treasurer to deposit \$29,000,000 into the Overcollections Fund from FY 2008-2009 state general fund receipts.

Authorizes and directs the state treasurer to deposit \$90 million from the Coastal Protection and Restoration Fund into the State Emergency Response Fund, notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary.

Provides that monies in the Rapid Response Fund at the end of FY 2008-2009 shall not be included in the determination of the fund balance, requiring the state treasurer to deposit \$10 million into the fund on July 1, 2009.

Authorizes and directs the state treasurer to deposit \$13.5 million into the state general fund from the Rapid Response Fund, notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary.

Authorizes and directs the state treasurer to deposit the following amounts from the specified funds into the Overcollections Fund, notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary:

Authorizes and directs the state treasurer to deposit \$21,825 into the Louisiana Duck License Stamp and Print Fund from the Conservation Fund.

Authorizes and directs the state treasurer to deposit \$65,014 into the Wildlife Habitat and Natural Heritage Fund from the Conservation Fund.

Authorizes and directs the state treasurer to deposit \$3,743 into the Louisiana Wild Turkey Stamp Fund from the Conservation Fund.

Provides that all bridge loan funding extended to the Dept. of Education from the State Emergency Response Fund due no later than the end of FY 2008-09 pursuant to Act No. 196 of the 2007 R.S. is extended to the end of FY 2009-2010.

All provisions of this Act shall become effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action, Provisions creating new special treasury funds, relative to the Vermilion Parish Visitor Enterprise Fund, providing for the restrictions of deposits into the Budget Stabilization Fund, transferring monies from the Incentive Fund for deposit into the state general fund, provisions related to the Insure La. Incentive Program Fund, and provisions related to the Rapid Response Fund shall be effective on July 1, 2009. All other provisions effective upon signature of governor (June 30, 2009).
