





1 Elementary and Secondary Education shall be subject to the following  
2 limitations:

3 (1) In order for a person who has been elected to a second consecutive  
4 term to be eligible as a candidate in the election for a successive term, that  
5 person must have received sixty percent or more of the votes cast in the election  
6 to his second consecutive term.

7 (2) In order for a person who has been elected to a third consecutive  
8 term to be eligible as a candidate in the election for a successive term, that  
9 person must have received seventy percent or more of the votes cast in the  
10 election to his third consecutive term.

11 (3) In order for a person who has been elected to a fourth consecutive  
12 term to be eligible as a candidate in the election for a successive term, that  
13 person must have received eighty percent or more of the votes cast in the  
14 election to his fourth consecutive term.

15 (4) In order for a person who has been elected to a fifth consecutive term  
16 of office to be eligible as a candidate in the election for any subsequent  
17 successive term, that person must have received ninety percent or more of the  
18 votes cast in the election to his previous consecutive term.

19 (5) If a person fails to qualify as a candidate for or fails to be elected to  
20 a consecutive term of office, but subsequently seeks to be a candidate for the  
21 same office at a later date, not less than four years from the expiration of his  
22 most recent term of office, then the limitations contained in this Paragraph shall  
23 apply beginning with Subparagraph (1) of this Paragraph.

24 C. This Section shall not apply to any person who is serving on any such  
25 board or commission on the effective date of this Section, except that it shall apply  
26 to any term of service of any such person that begins after such date.

27 Section 2. Be it further resolved that this proposed amendment shall be submitted  
28 to the electors of the state of Louisiana at the statewide election to be held on November 2,  
29 2010.

1 Section 3. Be it further resolved that this proposed amendment, if approved by the  
2 electors, shall become effective on January 31, 2012.

3 Section 4. Be it further resolved that on the official ballot to be used at said election  
4 there shall be printed a proposition, upon which the electors of the state shall be permitted  
5 to vote FOR or AGAINST, to amend the Constitution of Louisiana, which proposition shall  
6 read as follows:

7 Provides that in order for a person who has been elected to a second or  
8 subsequent consecutive term of office as lieutenant governor, secretary of  
9 state, attorney general, treasurer, commissioner of agriculture, commissioner  
10 of insurance, member of Public Service Commission, or member of Board  
11 of Elementary and Secondary Education to be eligible as a candidate in the  
12 election for a third or subsequent successive term of office, that person must  
13 have received sixty percent or more of the vote in the election for his second  
14 term, seventy percent or more of the vote in the election for his third term,  
15 eighty percent or more of the vote in the election for his fourth term, and  
16 ninety percent or more of the vote in the election for his fifth and subsequent

#### DIGEST

Proposed constitutional amendment provides that in order for a person who has been elected to a second or subsequent consecutive term of office as lieutenant governor, secretary of state, attorney general, treasurer, commissioner of agriculture, commissioner of insurance, member of Public Service Commission, or member of Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to be eligible as a candidate in the election for a third or subsequent successive term, that person must have received 60% or more of the vote in the election for his second term, 70% or more of the vote in the election for his third term, 80 % or more of the vote in the election for his fourth term, and 90% or more of the vote in the election for his fifth and subsequent successive terms.

Proposed constitutional amendment further provides that if a person fails to qualify as a candidate for or fails to be elected to a consecutive term of office, but subsequently seeks to be a candidate for the same office at a later date, not less than four years from the expiration of his most recent term of office, then the limitations contain in proposed constitutional amendment begin anew.

Specifies submission of the amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held on November 2, 2010.

Effective January 31, 2012.
