DIGEST

Present law includes the following definitions to define "racketeering activity": solicitation for murder, first degree murder, second degree murder, assault by drive-by shooting, aggravated kidnapping, second degree kidnapping, aggravated arson, carjacking, extortion, theft, certain controlled dangerous substance violations, pandering, and money laundering.

Proposed law retains the provisions of present law and adds all controlled dangerous substance violations and the following crimes to the definition of "racketeering activity": illegal use of weapons or dangerous instrumentalities; illegal carrying of weapons; possession of firearm or carrying concealed weapon by a person convicted of certain felonies; illegally supplying a felon with a firearm or carrying concealed weapon by a person convicted of certain felonies; illegally supplying a felon with a firearm; illegally supplying a felon with ammunition; aggravated battery; second degree battery of a police officer; disarming of a police officer; aggravated assault upon a police officer with a firearm; unlawful use of a laser upon a police officer; negligent injuring; vehicular negligent injuring; first degree negligent injuring; simple kidnapping; simple arson; aggravated criminal damage to property; simple criminal damage to property; aggravated burglary; simple burglary; simple burglary of an inhabited dwelling; unauthorized entry of inhabited dwelling; criminal trespass; first degree robbery; second degree robbery; and simple robbery.
