SPECIAL DISTRICTS. Provides relative to the renewal of parcel fees for the Oak Island Neighborhood Improvement District. (7/1/10)

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 33:9091.15(F)(3)(c), relative to Orleans Parish; to provide for
3 renewal elections of parcel fees for the Oak Island Neighborhood Improvement
4 District; and to provide for related matters.

5 Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

7 Section 1. R.S. 33:9091.15(F)(3)(c) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as
8 follows:

14 (c) If approved, the fee shall expire on December 31, 2014, but the fee may
15 be renewed if approved by a majority of the registered voters of the district voting
16 on the proposition at an election as provided in Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph.
17 Any election to authorize the renewal of the fee shall be held ~~only at the same time~~

1 ~~as the mayoral primary election for the city of New Orleans~~ **for that purpose in**
2 **accordance with the Louisiana Election Code.** If the fee is renewed, the term of
3 the imposition of the fee shall be as provided in the proposition authorizing such
4 renewal, not to exceed eight years.

6 Section 2. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2010.

DIGEST

Duplessis (SB 201)

Present law provides that the parcel fee for the Oak Island Neighborhood Improvement District shall expire on December 31, 2014, but the fee may be renewed. Any election to authorize the renewal of the fee shall be held only at the same time as the mayoral primary election for the city of New Orleans. If the fee is renewed, the term of the imposition of the fee shall be as provided in the proposition authorizing such renewal, not to exceed eight years.

Proposed law retains present law but changes the date of election that would authorize the renewal of the parcel fee from the mayoral primary to any regularly scheduled election in the city of New Orleans.

Effective July 1, 2010.
