Removes reciprocity provision allowing nonresident full-time students to purchase hunting and fishing licenses at resident rates. (8/15/10)

Present law authorizes the issuance at the resident rate of a hunting or fishing license to a nonresident full-time student enrolled in a Louisiana college or university. Provides that such license may be issued only to a student from a state which provides the same option to a Louisiana student enrolled full-time in a college or university in that state. Proposed law removes the reciprocity provision that other states must offer Louisiana students attending out-of-state college or university the option to purchase a hunting and fishing license at resident rates.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

The proposed legislation would have a minimal negative impact on Conservation Fund revenues. The impact for the difference in the resident and nonresident full-time student license fee is indeterminable at this time since the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries does not track the nonresident student hunting and fishing licenses fees separately by home state laws. Although the revenue generated per license would decrease, to the extent the decrease in cost encourages the purchase of additional licenses the anticipated revenue decrease may be partially offset.
