CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES OR SEE FISC NOTE GF EX Page 1 of 1
Provides relative to facilities providing housing or temporary residence to individuals referred by judicial agencies. (8/15/10)

The present law provides that any facility, including, pretrial diversion facilities, not otherwise required to be licensed by the Department of Health and Hospitals or the Department of Social Services, that provides housing or temporary residence for individuals who have been arrested for the commission of a crime and who are referred by any judicial agency, including the District Attorney's office, shall be regulated by rules adopted and enforced by the Department of Public Safety & Corrections (DPS&C) for the operation of such facilities. The proposed legislation removes the requirement that DPS&C enforce rules; requires that the facility must be inspected by the DPS&C prior to providing housing or temporary residence to any individual; and extends the period of time for facilities to be accredited by the American Correctional Association (ACA) from within 18 months (present law) of opening a judicial agency referral residential facility to 24 months and that the facility maintain accreditation by the ACA at all times thereafter.
