CRIMINAL RECORDS. Creates the Louisiana Arson Registry. (8/15/10)

SUMMARY OF HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO THE SENATE BILL

1. Technical.
2. Deleted unnecessary definitions from proposed law.
3. Deleted provision which required the state fire marshal to forward the offender's registration information to the bureau.
4. Deleted provision which required payment of \$60 annual registration fee to state fire marshal, to be deposited in the Louisiana Life Safety and Property Protection Trust Fund.

DIGEST OF THE SENATE BILL AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE

Proposed law creates the Louisiana Arson Registry.

Proposed law provides for definitions.

Proposed law provides that any person over the age of 17 who resides in this state and has pled guilty to, or has been convicted of an offense involving arson shall register with the state fire marshal.

Proposed law requires offenders to notify law enforcement of changes of address and residence.

Proposed law requires offenders to provide notification for five years on a first conviction and for the duration of their lifetime for a second or subsequent conviction, unless the underlying conviction is reversed, set aside, or vacated.

Proposed law provides for the following penalties:

- (1) On a first conviction, a fine of not more than \$500.
- (2) On a second or subsequent conviction, a fine of not more than \$1,000.

Effective August 15, 2010.
