Establishes an Intrastate Mutual Aid Compact

The proposed legislation creates and implements the Intrastate Mutual Aid Compact which is a system of intrastate mutual aid between parishes in the state, to provide and promote mutual assistance among the parishes in the prevention of, response to, and recovery from, an emergency or disaster occurring in a parish, or any other event that exceeds a parish's capability or resources. Also establishes an Intrastate Mutual Aid Subcommittee which will review progress and status of providing statewide mutual aid, to assist in developing methods to track and evaluate the activation of the mutual aid system, and to examine issues facing participating parishes. Members shall be entitled to be reimbursed for actual expenses for travel if funding is available. Requests for assistance shall be made through the Office of Emergency Preparedness of the requesting parish and directed to the Office of Emergency Preparedness of the responding parish. Requests shall be in writing and reported to the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness as soon as is practicable.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. The legislation is designed to provide the same structure on the state level as is currently in place nationally through the Federal Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC). The result of this legislation will be a process which ensures adequate coordination between parishes seeking support during an emergency or other event which is beyond a requesting parish's capabilities.

In addition, the Intrastate Mutual Aid Subcommittee is created which will be supported by the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness (GOHSEP). GOHSEP anticipates an increase in expenditures related to travel and administrative support related to the oversight of this subcommittee which will be absorbed within its existing budget (SGF) and will not require additional funding.
