

Prior law included the following definitions to define "racketeering activity": solicitation for murder, first degree murder, second degree murder, assault by drive-by shooting, aggravated kidnapping, second degree kidnapping, aggravated arson, carjacking, extortion, theft, certain controlled dangerous substance violations, pandering, and money laundering.

New law retains the provisions of prior law and adds possession of large quantities of marijuana (60 pounds up to 10,000 pounds) and the following crimes to the definition of "racketeering activity": simple kidnapping; simple arson; aggravated burglary; simple burglary; simple burglary of a pharmacy; simple burglary of an inhabited dwelling; unauthorized entry of inhabited dwelling; first degree robbery; second degree robbery; and simple robbery.
