
The original instrument and the following digest, which constitutes no part of the legislative instrument, were prepared by Christopher D. Adams.

DIGEST

Present law permits any sheriff having possession or control of cash bail bond which have been discharged and which remain unclaimed for more than three years or which belong to an owner who is unknown or who has not been heard from more than three years will be deposited into the general fund of the sheriff, and the sheriff will assume liability.

Present law requires the sheriffs in the parishes of Caddo, Plaquemines, East Baton Rouge, Bossier, and Saint Mary to deliver such bonds to the treasurer of the parish governing authority to be deposited in the parish general fund with the liability of the sheriff being relieved.

Present law states any owner who claims a cash bail bond deposited in the general fund of the sheriff or in the case of the parishes of Caddo, Plaquemines, East Baton Rouge, Bossier, and Saint Mary in the general fund of the parish governing authority will be reimbursed from these funds upon establishing a claim by a judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction.

Proposed law removes Plaquemines Parish from the list of specified parishes required to deposit such bonds in the general fund of the parish governing authority instead of the general fund of the sheriff.

Effective August 15, 2011.
