

1 WHEREAS, an assessment of the impact of dual enrollment initiatives on the success
2 of participating students would assist in the determination of the appropriate allocation of
3 funding; and

4 WHEREAS, it is appropriate that the Board of Regents and the State Board of
5 Elementary and Secondary Education conduct a thorough examination of these critical issues
6 with respect to dual enrollment programs.

7 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
8 urge and request the Board of Regents and the State Board of Elementary and Secondary
9 Education to study jointly the source, nature, and amount of funding allocated to various
10 units of public secondary and postsecondary education related to dual enrollment initiatives,
11 to determine the appropriateness of such funding, and to determine the impact of such
12 initiatives and to submit, in compliance with R.S. 24:771 and 772, a written report of their
13 findings and conclusions, including any recommendations for legislation relative to the
14 issue, to the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on Education not
15 later than sixty days prior to the beginning of the 2012 Regular Session of the Legislature
16 of Louisiana.

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the
18 chairman of the Board of Regents, the commissioner of higher education, the president of
19 the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, and the state superintendent of
20 education.
