Prefiled pursuant to Article III, Section 2(A)(4)(b)(i) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

PROCUREMENT: Enacts the Procurement Preference of Domestic Products Act

1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 39:1595.7, relative to procurement; to provide for a preference for the
3 purchase of items manufactured in the United States; to provide for an effective date;
4 and to provide for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 39:1595.7 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

7 §1595.7. Preference for items manufactured in the United States; definitions

8 A. This Section may be cited as the "Procurement of Domestic Products Act".

9 B. As used in this Section, the following definitions shall apply:

10 (1) "Manufactured in the United States" means produced by a process in
11 which the manufacturing, final assembly, processing, packaging, testing, and any
12 other process that adds value, quality, or reliability to assembled articles, materials,
13 or supplies, occur in the United States.

14 (2) "United States" means the United States and any place subject to the
15 jurisdiction of the United States.

16 C. In the event a contract is not entered into for products purchased under the
17 provisions of R.S. 39:1595, each procurement officer, purchasing agent, or similar
18 official who procures or purchases materials, supplies, products, provisions, or
19 equipment under the provisions of this Chapter may purchase such materials,

1 supplies, products, provisions, or equipment which are manufactured in the United
2 States, and which are equal in quality to other materials, supplies, products,
3 provisions, or equipment, provided that all of the following conditions are met:

4 (1) The cost of such items does not exceed the cost of other items which are
5 manufactured outside the United States by more than five percent.

6 (2) The vendor of such items agrees to sell the items at the same price as the
7 lowest bid offered on such items.

8 (3) In cases where more than one bidder offers items manufactured in the
9 United States which are within five percent of the lowest bid, the bidder offering the
10 lowest bid on such items is entitled to accept the price of the lowest bid made on
11 such items.

12 (4) The vendor certifies that such items are manufactured in the United
13 States.

14 D. The office of state purchasing may promulgate rules and regulations for
15 the implementation of this Section in accordance with the Administrative Procedure
16 Act.

17 Section 2. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2011; if vetoed by the governor
18 and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on July 1,
19 2011, or on the day following such approval by the legislature, whichever is later.

Abstract: Provides for the Procurement of Domestic Products Act relative to procurement of items manufactured in the United States.

Proposed law provides that "manufactured in the United States" means that the components, sub-components, parts, and equipment used in manufacturing, final assembly, processing, packaging, testing, or any other process that adds value, quality, or reliability to assembled articles, materials, or supplies, occurs in the U.S.

Proposed law provides that if a contract is not entered into for products purchased under the provisions of the law for preference of La. products (R.S. 39:1595), each procurement officer, purchasing agent, or similar official who procures or purchases materials, supplies,

products, provisions, or equipment under the Louisiana Procurement Code may purchase such materials, supplies, products, provisions, or equipment which are manufactured in the U.S., and which are equal in quality to other materials, supplies, products, provisions, or equipment, provided that all of the following conditions are met:

- (1) The cost of such items does not exceed the cost of other items which are manufactured outside the U.S. by more than 5%.
- (2) The vendor of such items agrees to sell the items at the same price as the lowest bid offered on such items.
- (3) In cases where more than one bidder offers items manufactured in the U.S. which are within 5% of the lowest bid, the bidder offering the lowest bid on such items is entitled to accept the price of the lowest bid made on such items.
- (4) The vendor certifies that such items are manufactured in the U.S.

Proposed law provides that the office of state purchasing may promulgate rules and regulations for the implementation of proposed law in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.

Effective July 1, 2011.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Appropriations to the original bill.

1. Deleted the following:
 - (a) Provision that when purchasing items, every procurement officer shall give preference to and purchase manufactured articles, materials, and supplies that have been manufactured in the U.S. and that such products shall be purchased unless the purchasing agency determines the procured products are not manufactured in the U.S. in reasonably available quantities.
 - (b) Provision that the chief procurement officer shall promulgate rules and regulations regarding the prequalification of suppliers and contractors.
 - (c) Provision that nothing is intended to contravene any existing treaty, law, agreement, or regulation of the U.S.
 - (d) Penalties if a contractor is awarded a contract and has knowledge that the products supplied were not manufactured in the U.S.
2. Added that if a contract for the purchase of products is not entered into under the provisions of the law for preference of La. products (R.S. 39:1595), each official who procures or purchases materials, supplies, products, provisions, or equipment may purchase items manufactured in the U.S., provided that all of the following conditions are met:
 - (a) The cost does not exceed the cost of other items which are manufactured outside the U.S. by more than 5%.

- (b) The vendor agrees to sell the items at the same price as the lowest bid offered on such items.
 - (c) If more than one bidder offers items manufactured in the U.S. within 5% of the lowest bid, the bidder offering the lowest bid is entitled to accept the price of the lowest bid.
 - (d) The vendor certifies that items are manufactured in the U.S.
3. Added that the office of state purchasing may promulgate rules and regulations in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.
