1 (2) In order to determine the suitability of an applicant, the office of alcohol
2 and tobacco control shall require members of a partnership recognized by Louisiana
3 law, the officers and directors of a corporation, the stockholders of a corporation, and
4 members of a limited liability company owning more than five percent of such a
5 corporation or company, to furnish to the office of alcohol and tobacco control a full
6 set of fingerprints to enable a criminal background investigation to be conducted.
7 The office of alcohol and tobacco control shall submit the completed fingerprint card
8 to the office of state police. The office of state police is authorized to submit the
9 fingerprints to the F.B.I. for a national criminal history background check.

10 (3) The office of alcohol and tobacco control shall require a background
11 investigation by means of fingerprint checks by the office of state police and the
12 F.B.I. of each applicant, members of a partnership recognized by Louisiana law, the
13 officers and directors of a corporation, the stockholders of a corporation, and
14 members of a limited liability company owning more than five percent of such a
15 corporation or company applying for an alcoholic beverage permit.

18 permit by means of fingerprint checks by the office of state police and the F.B.I.

21 stockholders of a corporation, and the members of a limited liability company
22 owning more than five percent of such a corporation or company applying for an
23 alcoholic beverage permit pursuant to this Chapter to be fingerprinted. Such
24 fingerprints shall be available for use by the office of state police and for transmittal
25 to the F.B.I. for a national criminal history record check. The information obtained
26 from the national criminal history record check conducted pursuant to this Section
27 may be used by the office of alcohol and tobacco control to determine the applicant's
28 eligibility for an alcoholic beverage permit.

29 (6) In order to determine the suitability of the spouses of those persons

1 required to submit fingerprints in accordance with this Section, and all other persons
 2 required to possess the same qualifications required of the applicant, except for those
 3 persons otherwise provided for in this Section, the office of alcohol and tobacco
 4 control shall require such persons to provide verification of suitability in accordance
 5 with rules adopted by the commissioner pursuant to the Administrative Procedure
 6 Act. Fingerprints shall not be required unless the commissioner requests fingerprints
 7 based upon credible information that a person may not meet the qualifications of an
 8 applicant.

9 **J. All licensees and persons required to be qualified pursuant to the**
 10 **provisions of this Chapter shall have a continuing duty to inform the**
 11 **commissioner of any action which they believe would constitute a violation of**
 12 **this Chapter. No person who so informs the commissioner shall be**

19 §280. Qualifications of applicants for permits

20 A. Applicants for state and local permits of all kinds shall meet the following
 21 qualifications and conditions:

22 (1) Be a person of good character and reputation and over eighteen years of
 23 age.

24 (2) Be a citizen of the United States and of the state of Louisiana and a
 25 resident of the state of Louisiana continuously for a period of not less than two years
 26 next preceding the date of the filing of the application. However, the requirements
 27 as to Louisiana citizenship do not apply to wholesale or retail dealers who have
 28 continuously held permits since July 26, 1944.

29 (3) Be the owner of the premises, have a bona fide written lease therefor, or

1 be a commercial lessor or a non-commercial lessor licensed pursuant to R.S. 4:701
2 et seq., exclusively for and for the sole purpose of conducting charitable gaming. In
3 cases where the applicant holds a bona fide written lease, the name and current street
4 address of the lessor shall be shown on the application form filed with the
5 commissioner.

6 (4) Have not been convicted of a felony under the laws of the United States,
7 the state of Louisiana, or any other state or country.

8 (5) Have not been convicted in this or in any other state or by the United
9 States of soliciting for prostitution, pandering, letting premises for prostitution,
10 contributing to the delinquency of juveniles, keeping a disorderly place, letting a
11 disorderly place, or illegally dealing in controlled dangerous substances.

12 (6) **If the applicant is also applying for a video gaming license under the**
13 **provisions of R.S. 27:310, have not been convicted in this or in any other state**
14 **or by the United States or any other country of theft or any crime involving**
15 **false statements or declarations, or gambling as defined by the laws and**
16 **ordinances of any municipality, any parish, any state, or the United States.**

28 the discretion of the local licensing authorities.

29 ~~(9)~~(10) Not owe the state or the local governmental subdivisions in which the

1 application is made any delinquent sales taxes, penalties, or interest excluding items
2 under formal appeal pursuant to applicable statutes.

3 ~~(10)~~**(11)** Not be the spouse of a person who does not meet the requirements
4 of Paragraphs (1) and (3) through ~~(9)~~**(10)** of this Subsection; however, in such cases
5 the age of the ineligible spouse shall be immaterial.

8 (2) In the granting of a permit, a conviction or plea of guilty or nolo
9 contendere by the applicant shall not constitute an automatic disqualification of the
10 applicant as otherwise required pursuant to the provisions of Paragraph (A)~~(4)~~, **(5)**,
11 **and (6)** of this Section, if all of the following criteria are met:

13 **H. If the applicant is also applying for a video gaming license under the**
14 **provisions of R.S. 27:310, notwithstanding the provisions of Subsections F and**
15 **G, evidence of or relating to an arrest, summons, charge, or indictment of an**
16 **applicant, or the dismissal thereof, may be considered by the commissioner in**
17 **determining suitability even if the arrest, summons, charge or indictment**
18 **results in deferred adjudication, probation, parole, or pardon.**

19 **I.** (1) In order to determine suitability, the applicant, members of a
20 partnership recognized by Louisiana law, officers and directors of a corporation, the
21 stockholders of a corporation, and members of a limited liability company owning
22 more than five percent of such corporations and companies shall be fingerprinted.
23 If no disqualifying record is identified at the state level, the fingerprints shall be

26 Investigation (F.B.I.) for a national criminal history record check.

27 (2) In order to determine the suitability of an applicant, the office of alcohol
28 and tobacco control shall require the members of a partnership recognized by
29 Louisiana law, officers and directors of a corporation, the stockholders of a

1 corporation, and members of a limited liability company owning more than five
2 percent of such corporations and companies, to furnish to the office of alcohol and
3 tobacco control a full set of fingerprints to enable a criminal background
4 investigation to be conducted. The office of alcohol and tobacco control shall submit
5 the completed fingerprint card to the office of state police. The office of state police
6 is authorized to submit the fingerprints to the F.B.I. for a national criminal history
7 background check.

8 (3) The office of alcohol and tobacco control shall require a background
9 investigation by means of fingerprint checks by the office of state police and the
10 F.B.I. of each applicant, members of a partnership recognized by Louisiana law,
11 officers and directors of a corporation, the stockholders of a corporation, and the
12 members of a limited liability company owning more than five percent of such
13 corporations or companies applying for an alcoholic beverage permit.

14 (4) In addition to the other requirements established by law, the submittal of
15 fingerprints shall be a prerequisite to the issuance of a permanent alcoholic beverage
16 permit by means of fingerprint checks by the office of state police and the F.B.I.

22 be available for use by the office of state police and for transmittal to the F.B.I. for
23 a national criminal history record check. The information obtained from the national
24 criminal history record check conducted pursuant to this Section may be used by the
25 office of alcohol and tobacco control to determine the applicant's eligibility for an
26 alcoholic beverage permit.

27 (6) In order to determine the suitability of the spouses of those persons
28 required to submit fingerprints in accordance with this Section, and all other persons
29 required to possess the same qualifications required of the applicant, except for those

1 persons already provided for by this Section, the office of alcohol and tobacco
 2 control shall require such persons to provide verification of suitability in accordance
 3 with rules adopted by the commissioner pursuant to the Administrative Procedure
 4 Act. Fingerprints shall not be required unless the commissioner requests fingerprints
 5 based upon credible information that a person may not meet the qualifications of an
 6 applicant.

7 **J. All licensees and persons required to be qualified pursuant to the**
 8 **provision of this Chapter shall have a continuing duty to inform the**
 9 **commissioner of any action which they believe would constitute a violation of**

DIGEST

Morrell (SB 262)

Present law provides for the qualifications an applicant is required to possess in order to receive an alcoholic beverage permit or a dealer of malt/low alcoholic content permit.

Proposed law retains present law and requires that an applicant who is also applying for a video gaming license be a person:

1. Who has not been convicted in this or in any other state or by the United States or any other country of theft or any crime involving false statements or declarations, or gambling as defined by the laws and ordinances of any municipality, any parish, any state, or the United States.
2. Who has a spouse that has not been convicted of the above referenced offenses.

Proposed law provides that if the applicant is also applying for a video gaming license, the Commissioner of ATC is authorized to consider any arrest, summons, charge, or indictment of the applicant, or the dismissal there of in determining suitability even if the arrest, summons, charge or indictment results in deferred adjudication, probation, parole, or pardon.

Proposed law requires all licensees and persons required to be qualified by ATC have a continuing duty to inform the commissioner of any action which they believe would constitute a violation of alcohol beverage laws and further prohibits discrimination against

a person by an applicant or licensee because of supplying such information.

Proposed law requires all licensees and any other persons who have been found suitable to maintain suitability throughout the term of the license.

Effective August 1, 2012.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Judiciary B to the original bill.

1. Removes provisions relative to an applicant whose prior activities, criminal record, if any, reputation, habits, and associations do not pose a threat to the public interest of this state or to the effective regulation and control of alcoholic beverages, or create or enhance the dangers of unsuitable, unfair, or illegal practices, methods, and operations in the activities authorized by law and any financial arrangements incidental thereto.
2. Adds prohibition for applicants for a video gaming license from being convicted in this or in any other state or by the United States or any other country of theft or any crime involving false statements or declarations, or gambling as defined by the laws and ordinances of any municipality, any parish, any state, or the United States.
