RE1 NO IMPACT GF EX See Note

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Provides relative to qualifications of applicants for alcoholic beverage permits. (8/1/12)

Current law stipulates the qualifications for applicants for state and local alcoholic beverage permits issued by the LA Alcohol and Tobacco Control or a local entity, including a list of convictions, either state or federal, that would be disqualifiers. Current law also states that the licensee should be of good character.

Proposed law retains current law and states that the Commissioner may consider arrests in determining an applicant's character or reputation. Proposed law adds that a dual applicant for an alcohol permit and video gaming license may not be convicted of theft, crimes involving giving false statements or gambling (as defined by local, state or federal statute). Licensees have a duty to report violations, perceived or real. Once the permit is awarded, the bill appears to provide that suitability is maintained throughout the term of the permit, regardless of interim activity.
