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Bill Header: RETIREMENT BENEFITS: (Constitutional Amendment) Authorizes the legislature to provide for forfeiture of retirement benefits by public officials and employees who are convicted of felony acts associated with their positions.

Bill Information:

Current Law

The present constitution prohibits diminishing or impairing members' accrued benefits in any Louisiana public retirement system, including state, statewide, and local retirement systems.

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Proposed Law

Following the adoption of this proposed constitutional amendment, the legislature may enact legislation that will provide for the forfeiture of all or part of members' benefits in any public retirement system under the following conditions:

- The member is a person who holds or held any public office or employment, and
- The member has been convicted of a felony associated with and committed during his service in such public office or employment.

The legislature may provide that all or part of any forfeited benefit will be applied to reduce the unfunded accrued liability of the retirement system to which the member belongs.

Implications of the Proposed Changes

HB 9 does not change any benefit provisions associated with the public retirement systems of Louisiana. It merely gives the legislature the authority to enact legislation.

Cost Analysis:

Analysis of Actuarial Costs

Retirement Systems

There is no cost to this bill. Benefit provisions of the public retirement systems of Louisiana are not changed by the adoption of this amendment to the constitution.

Other Post Retirement Benefits

There is no cost to this bill. This bill is enabling legislation and does not, of itself, affect any rights of any persons to receive other post-retirement benefits.

Analysis of Fiscal Costs

There is no cost to this bill. This bill is enabling legislation and does not, of itself, change any administrative procedures for the public retirement systems of Louisiana or for any other government entity.
