Provides for the expenditure of public funds by any fire protection district, municipal fire department, or volunteer fire department. (8/1/12)

Purpose of Bill: This measure provides for the expenditure of public funds by any fire protection district, municipal fire department, or volunteer fire department to purchase awards (not to exceed \$100) such as: plaques, trophies, certificates, medals, or other mementos acknowledging an outstanding achievement or valiant act. The measure also provides for the purchase of a meal in conjunction with an event bestowing such awards not to exceed \$25 per recipient.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

This bill may increase local governmental expenditures for fire protection districts, municipal fire departments, and volunteer fire departments by an indeterminate amount across the state.

Expenditures for fire protection districts, municipal fire departments, and volunteer fire departments could increase for awards and meals provided to firefighters receiving an award at an event honoring outstanding achievements or valiant acts. The increased expenditures would be up to \$125 per recipient--\$100 maximum for the award and \$25 maximum for the meal.

Representatives of the Louisiana Municipal Association, Police Jury Association of Louisiana, and two fire protection districts expect the impact on local government expenditures to be minimal.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
