Subject: CPR training in high schools

Requires instruction relative to CPR and automated external defibrillators to be integrated into the curriculum of an existing required course of study in public high schools

The proposed legislation requires the governing authority of each public school to provide instruction to all students in grades 9 through 12 relative to CPR and the use of automated external defibrillators in accordance with the American Heart Association, American Red Cross or other nationally recognized programs. The bill does not require teachers to be a certified trainer of CPR and allows partnerships with emergency medical technicians, paramedics, nurses, firefighters and other licensed and certified individuals to provide instruction. The presence of an automated external defibrillator in the classroom is not required. Further requires the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) to monitor compliance of each governing authority.
