Proposed legislation requires the BOR to establish and maintain a data administration system for the collection of uniform data on all state financial aid programs to conduct and report on statewide financial aid trends, effectiveness, outcomes assessment, and other factors.

BOR reports that the provisions of this proposed legislation will have no fiscal impact on the agency's budget. BOR currently collects data on financial aid programs from the state's public institutions.
