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Makes revisions to the La. Election Code

Proposed law makes multiple technical changes to the election code.

Sections 1 & 3 of the proposed law will become effective upon signature of the governor or upon lapse of action by the governor pursuant to Article III, Section 18 of the LA Constitution. Section 2 of the proposed law will become effective on January 1, 2017.
