<u>Existing law generally provides that a person cannot be disqualified or considered ineligible</u> from the practice of a trade, occupation, or licensed profession due to a criminal record, unless the person has a conviction that is directly related to the position of employment or license sought. Provides for any decision barring a person from engaging in a such a trade, occupation, or licensed profession, due to a criminal conviction, to explicitly state the reasons for the decision. Further provides for complaints to be heard in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.

<u>New law</u> retains <u>existing law</u> and exempts the Dept. of Insurance from the provisions of <u>existing law</u>.

Effective upon signature of governor (June 9, 2016).
