Existing law provides for the calculation of child support when there is a joint custody order for shared custody and defines "shared custody".

<u>New law</u> expands <u>existing law</u> to provide for the calculation of child support in the absence of a joint custody order for shared custody if the court finds by a preponderance of the evidence that shared custody exists.

Existing law provides a definition of "split custody".

<u>New law</u> expands <u>existing law</u> to provide that even in the absence of a custody order or plan providing for split custody, split custody may exist if the court finds that it does by a preponderance of the evidence.

Effective August 1, 2016.
