Relative to the compulsory seat belt law, <u>prior law</u> provided that a person who violated <u>existing law</u> subsequent to Aug. 31, 1995, and prior to Nov. 1, 1995, must be issued a warning ticket only.

<u>New law</u> removes prior law.

<u>Prior law</u> provided that any person who violates <u>existing law</u> subsequent to Oct. 31, 1995, must be subject to certain penalties.

<u>New law</u> retains <u>existing law</u> but removes the reference to the expired time period provided in <u>prior law</u>.

<u>Prior law</u> provided that upon conviction of a first offense, the fine would be \$25, including all costs of court.

<u>New law</u> increases the fine from \$25 to \$50.

<u>Prior law</u> provided that upon conviction of a second offense, the fine would be \$50, including all costs of court.

<u>New law</u> increases the fine from \$50 to \$75.

<u>Prior law</u> provided that upon conviction of a third offense and any subsequent offense, the fine would be \$50, plus all costs of court.

<u>New law</u> increases the fine from \$50 to \$75.

Effective August 1, 2016.
