2 To amend and readopt House Rule 6.6(M)(20) and to adopt House Rule 6.6(G)(18) of the
3 Rules of Order of the House of Representatives to provide relative to standing
4 committee jurisdiction over matters regarding drinking water standards and water
5 resources.

7 that House Rule 6.6(M)(20) of the Rules of Order of the House of Representatives is hereby
8 amended and readopted and that House Rule 6.6(G)(18) of the Rules of Order of the House
9 of Representatives is hereby adopted to read as follows:

Abstract: Adds drinking water standards to the subject matter jurisdiction of the Committee on Health and Welfare and provides that laws regulating water resources are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Committee on Natural Resources and Environment.

Present House Rule provides that laws regulating clean water, drinking water, and ground water are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Committee on Natural Resources and Environment.

Proposed House Rule provides instead that laws regulating water resources are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Committee on Natural Resources and Environment and that drinking water standards are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Committee on Health and Welfare.
