AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 14:34.2(B) and 108(C), relative to offenses against law
3	enforcement officers; to amend criminal penalties for battery of a police officer and
4	for resisting an officer; and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 14:34.2(B) and 108(C) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as
7	follows:
8	§34.2. Battery of a police officer
9	* * *
10	B.(1) Whoever commits the crime of battery of a police officer shall be fined
11	not more than five hundred dollars and imprisoned not less than fifteen days nor
12	more than six months, with or without hard labor and without benefit of suspension
13	of sentence, for not more than one year.
14	(2) If at the time of the commission of the offense the offender is under the
15	jurisdiction and legal custody of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections,
16	or is being detained in any jail, prison, correctional facility, juvenile institution,
17	temporary holding center, halfway house, or detention facility, the offender shall be
18	fined not more than one thousand dollars and imprisoned, with or without hard labor
19	and without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence, for not less than

1 one year nor more than five years. Such sentence shall be consecutive to any other 2 sentence imposed for violation of the provisions of any state criminal law. Abstract: Amends the penalties for the crimes of battery of a police officer and resisting an officer to make these offenses felonies.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the crime of battery of a police officer and provides for penalties of a fine of not more than \$500 and imprisonment for not less than 15 days nor more than six months without benefit of suspension of sentence.

<u>Proposed law</u> amends the term of imprisonment to not more than one year and provides that it shall be served with or without hard labor.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the crime of resisting an officer and provides for penalties of a fine of not more than \$500 or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both.
