COMMENDATIONS. Commends the Louisiana Association for the Blind on its Ninetieth Anniversary.

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To commend and congratulate the Louisiana Association for the Blind of Shreveport,
3	Louisiana, on the occasion of its Ninetieth Anniversary and to recognize the many
4	opportunities and enrichment it provides for the visually impaired.
5	WHEREAS, on April 4, 1927, the Louisiana Association for the Blind (LAB) was
6	established through an alliance with the Shreveport Downtown Lions, a chapter of Lions
7	Clubs International, to improve the quality of life for visually impaired individuals by
8	providing training, services, and employment; and
9	WHEREAS, the LAB first began operations in the 1930s when in-house employment
10	for visually impaired workers was limited to the production of mops and brooms by hand;
11	and
12	WHEREAS, in the 1960s, the LAB product line began to evolve in an effort to
13	capture federal contracts for paper tablets and products used in governmental offices;
14	building on that success, the LAB expanded its product catalog to include copier paper,
15	cleaning products, and safety products, such as anti-slip traction stripping; and
16	WHEREAS, the LAB is proud of its affiliation with Fort Polk Army Base in
17	Leesville and Barksdale Air Force Base in Bossier Parish, as contractors who stock base
18	supply centers with products used by military personnel; and

1	WHEREAS, today, the LAB continues to maintain a safe and flexible work
2	environment in which each individual can reach his potential and personal goals; and
3	WHEREAS, as an approved provider of Louisiana Rehabilitation Services, the LAB
4	instructs adults in the acquisition of marketable skills necessary to enter the workforce; and
5	WHEREAS, the Louisiana Association for the Blind fulfills a wide variety of
6	contracts for commercial clientele that includes product assembly, manufacturing, and
7	packaging, along with a state-of-the-art digital printing operation; and
8	WHEREAS, its Low Vision Rehabilitation Center provides a full range of
9	rehabilitation and employment services and low-vision products and serves over two
10	thousand Louisianans annually; and
11	WHEREAS, instruction and services offered by the LAB include orientation and
12	mobility, Braille reading and writing, computer training, independent living, job readiness,
13	customer service and tech support training, low-vision evaluations, and programs for youth,
14	seniors, and community outreach; and
15	WHEREAS, loss of sight may occur at anytime, however extraordinary educational
16	techniques are implemented to teach infants and youngsters who would, under ordinary
17	circumstances, learn to navigate their environment by visual cues; and
18	WHEREAS, the LAB supports parental training and counseling and conducts an
19	annual Children's Clinic to provide assistance and adaptive technologies for school-age
20	children that enable these students to learn and explore the world around them through
21	reading; and
22	WHEREAS, the LAB scholarship fund was created to provide financial aid to the
23	state's visually challenged citizens who pursue career goals and postsecondary education;
24	and
25	WHEREAS, after ninety years, the mission of the Louisiana Association for the
26	Blind endures and the organization continues to expand its rehabilitation services and
27	provides innovative employment opportunities for individuals with visual impairment.
28	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
29	commend the Louisiana Association for the Blind on the occasion of its Ninetieth

Anniversary and recognize the many employment opportunities and enrichment it provides
