Prefiled pursuant to Article III, Section 2(A)(4)(b)(i) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

CRIME: Provides certain exceptions to the prohibition on wearing hoods, masks, and other facial disguises in public places

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 14:313(D) and to enact R.S. 14:313(C)(4), (5), (6), and (7),
3	relative to offenses affecting the public generally; to provide relative to the
4	prohibition on wearing hoods, masks, and other facial disguises in public places; to
5	provide an exception for persons driving or riding a motorcycle; to provide for
6	exceptions; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 14:313(D) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 14:313(C)(4),
9	(5), (6), and (7) are hereby enacted to read as follows:
10	§313. Masks or hoods, wearing Wearing of masks, hoods, or other facial disguises
11	in public places prohibited; penalty; exceptions; permit to conduct Mardi
12	Gras festivities , how obtained ; wearing of hoods, masks, or disguises or
13	giving of candy or other gifts by sex offenders

15	C. Except as provided in Subsection E of this Section, this Section shall not

18	(4) To persons driving or riding a motorcycle.
19	(5) To persons wearing a helmet or mask for medical purposes or reasons.

4	D. All persons having charge or control of any of the festivities set forth in
5	Paragraph $\frac{B(C)}{2}$ of this Section; shall, in order to bring the persons participating
6	therein within the exceptions contained in Paragraph $\frac{B}{C}(2)$, make written
7	application for and shall obtain in advance of the festivities from the mayor of the
8	city, town, or village in which the festivities are to be held, or when the festivities are
9	to be held outside of an incorporated city, town, or village, from the sheriff of the
10	parish, a written permit to conduct the festivities. A general public proclamation by
11	the mayor or sheriff authorizing the festivities shall be equivalent to an application
12	and permit.

Abstract: Provides for exceptions to the prohibition on wearing hoods, masks, and other facial disguises in public places.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits any person from wearing hoods, masks, and other facial disguises in any public place, and provides that whoever violates <u>present law</u> shall be imprisoned for not less than six months nor more than three years.

Present law further provides that this present law prohibition shall not apply to the following:

- (1) To activities of children on Halloween, to persons participating in any public parade or exhibition of an educational, religious, or historical character given by any school, church, or public governing authority, or to persons in any private residence, club, or lodge room.
- (2) To persons participating in masquerade balls or entertainments, to persons participating in carnival parades or exhibitions during the period of Mardi Gras festivities, to persons participating in the parades or exhibitions of minstrel troupes, circuses, or other dramatic or amusement shows, or to promiscuous masking on Mardi Gras which are duly authorized by the governing authorities of the municipality in which they are held or by the sheriff of the parish if held outside of an incorporated municipality.
- (3) To persons wearing head covering or veils pursuant to religious beliefs or customs.

Proposed law retains present law and adds exceptions to this prohibition for the following:

- (1) Persons driving or riding a motorcycle.
- (2) Persons wearing a helmet or mask for medical purposes or reasons.
- (3) Persons wearing a mask or hood for the purpose of protection against the elements or weather.
- (4) Persons engaged in a sporting or recreational activity.

(Amends R.S. 14:313(D); Adds R.S. 14:313(C)(4), (5), (6), and (7))

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

- The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Administration of</u> <u>Criminal Justice to the original bill:</u>
- 1. Amend the <u>proposed law</u> exception to the offense to provide that the offense shall not apply to persons riding or diving a motorcycle.
- 2. Add an exception for persons wearing a helmet for medical purposes or reasons.
- 3. Make technical corrections to citations in present law.

The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

- 1. Amend the <u>proposed law</u> exception regarding helmets worn for medical purposes to include in the exception masks worn for medical purposes or reasons.
- 2. Add an exception for persons wearing a mask or hood for the purpose of protection against the elements or weather.
- 3. Add an exception for persons engaged in a sporting or recreational activity.
