Creates a special fund for the purpose of funding early childhood education in Louisiana

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Proposed legislation creates the Louisiana Early Childhood Education Fund and requires an annual deposit of \$10 M from the state general fund as well as appropriations, grants or donations received by the state or the Department of Education; unexpended funds at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the fund. The fund shall be administered by the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) which shall award monies on a competitive basis to city, parish and local school districts and other entities operating early childhood education programs for children aged three and under. Awards shall require matching funds from non-state sources at a rate of at least two to one.

## **EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

There will be an increase in expenditures by BESE for early childhood education programs to the extent grants out of the Early Childhood Education Fund are awarded to local districts and entities. Expenditures of local school districts and early childhood organizations will also increase as a result of matching fund requirements to obtain such grants.

To the extent these funds currently support recurring state expenditures, there will be a reduction in SGF expenditures of state agencies due to the transfer of \$10 M from the SGF to the new statutorily dedicated fund.

## **REVENUE EXPLANATION**

There will be a reduction in state general fund in the amount of \$10 M due to the transfer of funds from the state general fund to the Early Childhood Education Fund.
