Abstract: Exempts firefighters issued a special retired firefighter license plate from the motor vehicle registration license fee or tax.

<u>Present law</u> provides for an annual motor vehicle registration license fee or tax on all private passenger vehicles.

<u>Present law</u> further provides for the issuance of a special firefighters license plate for active and retired firefighters. <u>Present law</u> requires firefighters issued the plate to pay a one-time fee of \$25 in addition to the annual motor vehicle registration license fee or tax.

<u>Proposed law</u> allows those retired firefighters issued a special firefighters license plate pursuant to <u>present law</u> and who have served for 20 or more years to be exempt from the annual motor vehicle registration license fee or tax.

<u>Proposed law</u> clarifies that <u>proposed law</u> does not exempt any firefighter receiving a specialty license plate from the initial one-time fee in present law.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the issuance of a lifetime specialty firefighters license plate to those retired firefighters who have served for 20 or more years.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires those retired firefighters who wish to be exempt from the motor vehicle registration or license tax submit a certification from their retirement system attesting to their service of 20 or more years.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Transportation</u>, <u>Highways and Public Works</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:

- 1. Make technical changes.
- 2. Remove active, full-time professional firefighters from those eligible for the registration fee exemption.

3.	Add a provision that requires those firefighters applying for the fee exemption to submit a certification from their retirement system attesting to their eligibility.
