<u>Present law</u> classifies certain types of cancer as occupational diseases or infirmities connected with the duties of a firefighter.

<u>Present law</u> provides that cancers are included in the occupational diseases connected with the duties of a firefighter, but limits cancer to those disabling cancers originating in the bladder, brain, colon, liver, pancreas, skin, kidney, or gastrointestinal or tract, and leukemia, lymphoma, and multiple myeloma.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and further provides that prostate cancer, testicular cancer, a cancer originating in the reproductive tract, are cancers which are to be included as an occupational disease category for firefighters.

<u>Proposed law</u> removes the requirement that the cancer be disabling or any other type of cancer, due to occupational exposure, for which firefighters are determined to have a statistically significant increased risk over that of the general population.

Effective August 1, 2017.
