TRAFFIC. Provides for driver education to include instruction on appropriate driver conduct when stopped by a law enforcement officer. (1/1/18)

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 32:402.1(A)(1)(a) and (2)(b), 407(A)(2)(a), and 408(A)(1),
3	relative to driver education; to provide for driver education to include instruction
4	relative to appropriate driver conduct when stopped by a law enforcement officer;
5	and to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 32:402.1(A)(1)(a) and (2)(b), 407(A)(2)(a), and 408(A)(1) are hereby
8	amended and reenacted to read as follows:
9	§402.1. Driver education; required
10	A. No application for a license for the operation of a motor vehicle shall be
11	received from any person making application for the first time unless there is also
12	submitted with the application, on a form approved by the secretary of the
13	Department of Public Safety and Corrections, public safety services, written
14	evidence of the successful completion by the applicant of one of the following:
15	(1)(a) A "driver education course" for any person under the age of eighteen,
16	which shall consist of not less than eight hours of actual driving instruction and thirty
17	hours of classroom instruction. A person shall not be allowed to receive more than

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1	four hours of actual driving instruction on any single calendar day. The Department
2	of Public Safety and Corrections, public safety services, shall establish rules and
3	regulations to administer and define the requirements of the course. The rules and
4	regulations established by the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, public
5	safety services, shall provide for instruction relative to trailer safety and, to the
6	economic effects of littering, and to appropriate driver conduct when stopped by
7	a law enforcement officer. Oversight review of these rules shall be conducted by
8	the House and Senate committees on transportation, highways and public works in
9	accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.
10	* * *
11	(2) A "prelicensing training course" from any person eighteen years or older
12	if a driver education course is not completed. The prelicensing training course shall
13	consist of a minimum of six hours of classroom instruction and a minimum of eight
14	hours of actual driving instruction. A person shall not be allowed to receive more
15	than four hours of actual driving instruction on any single calendar day. The
16	Department of Public Safety and Corrections, public safety services, shall establish
17	rules and regulations to administer and define the requirements of the course.
18	Oversight review of these rules shall be conducted by the House and Senate
19	committees on transportation, highways and public works in accordance with the
20	Administrative Procedure Act. The rules shall provide for:

22	(b) Course content and presentation, including content relative to trailer
23	safety and, to the economic effects of littering, and to appropriate driver conduct
24	when stopped by a law enforcement officer.

26	§407. Application of minors; revocation; applications of persons less than
27	twenty-one years of age
28	A.(1) * * * *
29	(2)(a) Upon completion of a driver's education course approved by the

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Department of Public Safety and Corrections, public safety services, and upon 1 2 passing a visual examination and a road knowledge test, including rules of the road, 3 signs, and signals, sharing the road with motorcycles and tractor/trailer trucks, 4 knowledge of distracted driving issues, knowledge of trailer safety, knowledge of appropriate driver conduct when stopped by a law enforcement officer, and not 5 less than two questions relative to railroad and highway grade railroad safety, an 6 7 applicant at least fifteen years of age, but less than seventeen years of age, applying 8 for the first time may be issued a Class "E" learner's license. The license may be 9 issued for a four-year period at the same fee as a Class "E" driver's license and must 10 be maintained for at least one hundred eighty days, unless prior to such time the 11 driver reaches seventeen years of age, prior to being converted to a Class "E" intermediate driver's license. The Class "E" learner's license shall authorize the 12 13 holder to drive while being accompanied by a licensed parent, guardian, adult at least age twenty-one or older, or licensed sibling at least age eighteen or older. 14

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§408. Examination of applicants required; classes of licenses

A.(1) Except as otherwise provided, every applicant must pass a written 17 knowledge and skills test for a motor vehicle representative of the type of motor 18 19 vehicle he operates or expects to operate, or provide evidence on a form approved by the department that he has successfully passed the written knowledge test and a 20 driving or skills test administered by an authorized third party. In addition to the 21 specialized knowledge and skills tests, each such examination shall include: a test 22 of the applicant's eyesight; his ability to understand highway signs regulating, 23 24 warning, and directing traffic; his knowledge of railroad and highway grade crossing safety; his knowledge of sharing the road with motorcycles and tractor/trailer trucks; 25 his knowledge of the economic effects of littering; his knowledge of distracted 26 27 driving issues; his knowledge of trailer safety; his knowledge of appropriate driver conduct when stopped by a law enforcement officer; and his knowledge of all 28 29 relevant traffic regulations.

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Section 2. This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2018.

Gatti

<u>Present law</u> requires individuals who apply for a driver's license to submit written evidence of successful completion of either a "driver education course" or "prelicensing training course".

<u>Present law</u> requires the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, public safety services, to establish rules and regulations to administer and define the requirements of driver education and prelicensing training courses.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and requires driver education and prelicensing training courses to include course content relative to appropriate driver conduct when stopped by a law enforcement officer.

<u>Present law</u> requires individuals, as part of the application procedure to obtain a license to operate a motor vehicle, to pass a road knowledge test which includes rules of the road, signs, and signals, sharing the road with motorcycles and tractor/trailer trucks, economic effects of littering, distracted driving, trailer safety, and not less than two questions relative to railroad and highway grade crossing safety, and knowledge of all relevant traffic regulations.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds requirement that the road knowledge test include knowledge of appropriate driver conduct when stopped by a law enforcement officer.
