LEGISLATORS. Affirms the need for civility in political discourse and debate as a fundamental requirement for effective representative democracy and governing.

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2 To affirm the need for civility in political discourse and debate as a fundamental requirement for effective representative democracy and governing. 3 4 WHEREAS, representative democracy in the United States of America presents to 5 the world an ongoing experiment as to whether such form of government can be viable, lasting, and most effective over all other forms of government in best serving the needs of 6 7 its people; and 8 WHEREAS, our representative democracy is only as good as those whom we elect 9 to represent us, and the resulting laws and policies made by them to which we are subject; 10 and 11 WHEREAS, a fundamental and necessary cornerstone of effective representative democracy and governing is productive communication between the people and their 12 13 representatives, and among the elected representatives themselves; and 14 WHEREAS, an equally fundamental and necessary cornerstone of effective representative democracy and governing is also the participation by those with differing 15 16 viewpoints in public political discourse and debate through the robust exchange of ideas; and 17 WHEREAS, such robust exchange of ideas in public political discourse and debate is an essential component of our political freedom; and 18

1	WHEREAS, civility in public political discourse and debate promotes understanding,
2	unity, mutual respect, informed decision making, reflection, and considerations in the spirit
3	of community for compromise and consensus in the greater good; and
4	WHEREAS, civility in public political discourse and debate further enhances
5	confidence in our institutions of government, and in the ability of our elected representatives
6	to govern effectively at the federal, state, and local levels; and
7	WHEREAS, through civility in public political discourse and debate our elected
8	representatives and the public can engage in productive dialogue with each other and among
9	themselves without compromise of core principles or loss of collegiality; and
10	WHEREAS, civility in public political discourse and debate results from adherence
11	to simple principles, including the following: be inclusive and show respect; listen and pay
12	attention to the words of others; take responsibility for your own words and actions,
13	including apologizing for them when appropriate; strive to be informed, tolerant, and
14	agreeable; in your language seek unity through compromise and consensus rather than
15	fostering division through anger, invective, and harsh rhetoric; and refrain from
16	disparagement of others and from criticism that is not constructive; and
17	WHEREAS, through civility in their public political discourse and debate, elected
18	representatives demonstrate statesmanship in their interactions and inspire others to act
19	likewise; and
20	WHEREAS, through civility in their public political discourse and debate, elected
21	representatives foster a spirt of mutual understanding that enhances cooperation and
22	consensus, restores public trust, and leads to more efficient and effective government; and
23	WHEREAS, by authoring this Resolution the members of the Legislature of
24	Louisiana affirm that by so doing they endorse the essential need for civility in public
25	political discourse and debate, and further that they commit to such civility in their own
26	actions and debate and to seeking others to act likewise.
27	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
28	affirm the need for civility in political discourse and debate as a fundamental requirement
29	for effective representative democracy and governing.
