EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. The proposed law adds medical examiners, coroners, licensed substance abuse addiction counselors, probation and parole officers, specialty courts within the criminal justice system, parents, legal guardians, legal health care agents, and executors of a will or estate to the list of those that may access the prescription monitoring program database in certain circumstances. The Louisiana Board of Pharmacy controls this access based on the guidelines provided in the bill. Existing staff of the board can absorb the additional duties of granting access, which is expected to be minimal.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

To the extent that a person or entity knowingly accesses prescription monitoring information in violation of the law, the board may impose a fine of not more than five thousand dollars. The amount of revenue that may be generated through the imposition of a fine is indeterminable.
