BOATS/SHIPS/VESSELS: Requests the Wildlife and Fisheries Commission to adopt rules requiring kayak fishermen to display a safety flag

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the Wildlife and Fisheries Commission to adopt rules that require a
3	fisherman using a kayak to use and display a kayak safety flag.
4	WHEREAS, kayak fishing is a rapidly growing sport in Louisiana with ever
5	increasing numbers of people and kayaks on the waters of the state; and
6	WHEREAS, many fishermen consider the coastal marshes of Louisiana to be the
7	preferred areas for fishing from a kayak, allowing the fisherman to test his skill against
8	speckled trout and redfish; and
9	WHEREAS, there are many other watercraft in use in the coastal marshes, usually
10	boats propelled by motors and capable of moving at a much faster rate of speed than are the
11	kayaks, including other fishermen, work boats, surveyors, tugboats, and airboats; and
12	WHEREAS, because of the height of the marsh grasses and the low profile offered
13	by a fisherman in a kayak, a motorized vessel operator cannot see the kayak around curves
14	or corners in the marsh, thus creating a situation that is potentially extremely dangerous for
15	both the kayak fisherman and the motorized boater; and
16	WHEREAS, a kayak fisherman using and displaying a kayak safety flag that is at
17	least as high as the kayak is long would be seen by other approaching watercraft, even
18	around curves and corners in the marsh, because the flag would be visible above the marsh
19	grasses.
20	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
21	urge and request the Wildlife and Fisheries Commission to adopt rules that require a

- 1 fisherman using a kayak to use and display a kayak safety flag that is at least as long as the
- 2 kayak to which it is attached.
 - BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the
- 4 chairman of the Wildlife and Fisheries Commission.
