<u>Prior law</u> provided that an estate situated below is bound to receive the surface waters that flow naturally from an estate situated above, unless an act of man has created the flow.

<u>New law</u> provides that an estate situated below is the servient estate and is bound to receive the surface waters that flow naturally from a dominant estate situated above, unless an act of man has created the flow.

<u>Prior law</u> provided that the owner of the servient estate may not do anything to prevent the flow of the water. <u>Prior law</u> further provided that the owner of the dominant estate may not do anything to render the servitude more burdensome.

<u>New law</u> provides that the owner of the servient estate situated below may not do anything to prevent the flow of the water. <u>New law</u> further provides that the owner of the dominant estate situated above may not do anything to render the servitude more burdensome.

Effective upon signature of the governor (June 12, 2017).
