Provides relative to bullying. (gov sig)

Current law requires each public school governing authority to adopt a student code of conduct which includes any disciplinary action to be taken against a student who violates the code; further requires that the code prohibits bullying. Proposed law authorizes a school employee who witnesses an incident of bullying to take all steps necessary to stop the behavior, including reasonable force or physical restraint. Authorizes a school official to contact law enforcement and have the student removed from school grounds. When a determination has been made that a student has been the victim of bullying, extends parental option to either have the victim of the bullying act transferred to another school, or have the student committing the bullying transferred to another school. Provides for school employee immunity in certain instances. Names the Act the Haley Danielle Cox and Katlin Simone Loux Act. Effective upon governor's signature.
