

SENATE FLOOR AMENDMENTS

2017 Regular Session

Amendments proposed by Senator Cortez to Engrossed House Bill No. 468 by Representative Emerson

1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

2 On page 1, line 5, after "preemption;" insert "to provide terms and conditions;"

3 AMENDMENT NO. 2

4 On page 3, after line 18, insert:

5 "D. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, beginning January 1,
6 2018, and thereafter, the board shall maintain a list of persons who perform natural
7 hair braiding services and meet the following requirements:

8 (1) Be at least sixteen years of age.

9 (2) On an annual basis, certifies to the board that they have reviewed the board's
10 brochure on sanitation and completed the self-test contained within the brochure or
11 completed an online sanitation training video developed by the board. A link to the
12 brochure and online training shall be on the board's public website. The board shall
13 make available a copy of the brochure to any interested person. The board shall
14 acknowledge completion of the test or training and issue a certificate of completion
15 to the person.

16 E. Failure of the board to offer the sanitation brochure or online sanitation training
17 shall waive the necessity of satisfaction of the requirement set forth in Paragraph
18 (A)(2) of this Section and such persons shall be included in the list maintained by the
19 board.

20 F. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, any person permitted as an
21 alternative hair designer before January 1, 2018, shall be able to perform natural hair
22 braiding in licensed salons without the necessity of compliance with the provisions
23 of this Section and rules adopted pursuant thereto.

25 Section 2. The Louisiana State Board of Cosmetology shall adopt rules prior to
26 January 1, 2018, in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act to implement
27 the provisions of this Act.

28 Section 3. The provisions of Section 1 of this Act shall become effective on January
29 1, 2018."
