1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 3:2364 and 2366(A), (B), (C), (D)(introductory paragraph), and
3	(E)(introductory paragraph) and (1), and R.S. 47:120.71(section heading) and (A),
4	to enact R.S. 36:629(C)(9), and to repeal R.S. 3:2365 and R.S. 36:4(W), relative to
5	the Louisiana Animal Control Advisory Task Force; to provide for the creation of
6	the Louisiana Animal Control Advisory Task Force; to provide for task force
7	membership and terms of office; to provide for the powers and duties of the state
8	veterinarian in relation to the task force; to abolish the Louisiana Animal Welfare
9	Commission and the Louisiana Pet Registry; to provide for the Louisiana Animal
10	Shelter Registry; to direct donations from the Louisiana Animal Welfare
11	Commission income tax checkoff to the Louisiana Pet Overpopulation Advisory
12	Council; to provide relative to reporting requirements; and to provide for related
13	matters.
14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
15	Section 1. R.S. 3:2364 and 2366 (A), (B), (C), (D)(introductory paragraph), and
16	(E)(introductory paragraph) and (1) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
17	§2364. Louisiana Animal Welfare Commission Louisiana Animal Control Advisory
18	Task Force
19	A. Definition. For purposes of this Section, "animal" shall mean dogs and
20	cats.
21	B. Creation and membership. (1) The Louisiana Animal Welfare
22	Commission is hereby created within the office of the governor for the purpose of

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1	assisting the governor's office of community programs to ensure and promote the
2	proper treatment and well-being of animals. The commission shall receive no direct
3	funding from the state, but may receive incidental services from state agencies in
4	order to carry out its purpose.
5	(2) Members of the commission shall serve four-year terms and shall not
6	receive any compensation or reimbursement of expenses. Each member of the
7	commission shall hold office until the appointment and qualification of his
8	successor. Whenever a vacancy occurs in an appointed position, the vacancy shall
9	be filled in the same manner and under the same terms and conditions as required for
10	the original appointment. The commission shall meet at the call of the chairman at
11	least quarterly and more often if necessary.
12	(3) The executive director of the governor's office of community programs
13	or his designee shall be a member of the commission. Other members of the
14	commission shall be appointed by the governor in accordance with the following
15	provisions:
16	(a) One representative of the Louisiana Department of Health.
17	(b) One small animal veterinarian, appointed at large.
18	(c) One member who is a director of a public animal control agency.
19	(d) One commercial breeder of dogs.
20	(e) Three representatives from separately operating humane societies or
21	private animal shelters.
22	(f) One representative from the Louisiana State Police.
23	(g) One member of the public, appointed at large.
24	(h) Two representatives appointed from a list of five nominations submitted
25	by the Louisiana Veterinary Medical Association.
26	(i) One representative of the Louisiana Quarterhorse Association.
27	(j) One representative of the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association.
28	(4) The governor shall appoint the initial chairman and initial vice chairman
29	of the commission from members appointed by the governor. Thereafter, the
30	members shall elect the chairman and vice chairman every odd-numbered year.

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1	(5) The domicile of the commission shall be in East Baton Rouge Parish.
2	C. Transaction of business. A majority of the membership shall constitute
3	a quorum for the transaction of official business. All official actions of the
4	commission shall require the affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the
5	commission.
6	D. Duties and functions. The commission shall have powers and duties
7	necessary to carry out its purpose, including but not limited to the following:
8	(1) To support local and municipal animal control enforcement efforts.
9	(2) To support law enforcement in the investigation and prosecution of
10	animal cruelty cases.
11	(3) To make recommendations concerning the care and keeping of animals.
12	(4) To coordinate a statewide voluntary pet database that will assist animal
13	owners in recovering lost animals.
14	(5) To provide a centralized public animal information, education, and
15	communication service.
16	(6) To formulate and implement proposals to deal with pet overpopulation.
17	(7) To make recommendations for rules and regulations, which may be
18	adopted by parish and local authorities for the proper care and treatment of animals.
19	(8) To gather information from public records pertaining to the animals
20	within the purview of the commission. The government custodians of such records
21	shall make them accessible to the commission upon request under the provisions of
22	R.S. 44:1 et seq.
23	(9) To inspect any animal impoundment facility for the purpose of making
24	recommendations to the appropriate governing authority for improvements to those
25	facilities and their operations wherever such facilities are operated by a government
26	animal control agency or designated by municipal or parish governments to be used
27	for the purpose of impoundment of animals. The governing authority shall provide
28	to the commission reasonable access to the facility, its records, and personnel within
29	seven days of receipt of a written request.

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1	(10) To request, in the form of a letter to the appropriate governing authority,
2	an animal control agency to produce public records pertaining to animal intake,
3	adoption, and euthanasia.
4	(11) To establish and maintain the Louisiana Animal Shelter Registry.
5	E. Louisiana Animal Welfare Fund. (1) The commission may accept and
6	solicit advice, services, and donations. Donations shall be remitted immediately to
7	the state treasury. After compliance with the requirements of Article VII, Section
8	9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana relative to the Bond Security and Redemption
9	Fund, the monies shall be deposited in the Louisiana Animal Welfare Fund,
10	hereinafter referred to as the "fund", which is hereby created within the state treasury
11	and shall be used solely to carry out the functions and duties of the Louisiana Animal
12	Welfare Commission.
13	(2) The commission shall maintain a checking account in a Louisiana
14	licensed banking establishment for holding and distributing money that may be
15	transferred from the fund to be used by the commission in fulfillment of its purposes.
16	The checking account shall be entitled "Louisiana Animal Welfare Commission".
17	It shall be held jointly in the names of the current chairman and treasurer of the
18	commission. All checks shall require joint signatures.
19	(3) The treasurer of the state of Louisiana shall transfer monies from the fund
20	upon receiving a written order signed by the chairman and treasurer of the
21	commission. If the funds are insufficient to meet the full amount of the order, the
22	treasurer of the state of Louisiana may transfer the remaining balance in the fund.
23	The transfer of monies in the fund to the commission's checking account shall be
24	made within five business days of receiving the written order.
25	(4) The financial records of the commission shall be maintained by the
26	treasurer of the commission. A copy of the records, jointly certified by the treasurer
27	and the chairman, shall be provided by the chairman to the legislative auditor for
28	inspection within twenty business days of the close of the state's fiscal year. The
29	legislative auditor shall report the findings of the inspection to the governor and the

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1	chairman of the commission within ninety days of receiving the certified copy of the
2	records.
3	A. For purposes of this Section, the term "animal" shall mean a dog or cat.
4	B. The Louisiana Animal Control Advisory Task Force is hereby created
5	within the office of the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry under the
6	direction of the state veterinarian for the purpose of assisting community programs
7	in ensuring and promoting the proper treatment and well-being of animals. The task
8	force shall consist of the following seven members to be appointed by the
9	commissioner of agriculture:
10	(1) One member who is a small animal veterinarian.
11	(2) One member who is a director of a public animal control agency.
12	(3) Two individuals from the public at large.
13	(4) One representative from the Louisiana Animal Control Association.
14	(5) One representative from the Louisiana Veterinary Medical Association.
15	(6) The state veterinarian.
16	C. The state veterinarian shall have the powers and duties necessary to carry
17	out the purposes of this Section, including but not limited to the following:
18	(1) Support local and municipal animal control enforcement efforts.
19	(2) Support law enforcement in the investigation and prosecution of animal
20	cruelty cases.
21	(3) Make recommendations concerning the care and keeping of animals.
22	(4) Coordinate a statewide voluntary pet database that will assist animal
23	owners in recovering lost animals.
24	(5) Formulate and implement proposals to deal with animal overpopulation.
25	(6) Promulgate rules and regulations that may be adopted by parish and local
26	authorities for the proper care and treatment of animals.
27	(7) Inspect animal impoundment facilities for the purpose of making
28	recommendations to the appropriate governing authority for improvements to those
29	facilities and their operations wherever such facilities are operated by a government
30	animal control agency or designated by municipal or parish governments to be used

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1	for the purpose of impoundment of animals. The governing authority shall provide
2	the state veterinarian, or his designee, with reasonable access to the facility, and
3	access to its records, and personnel within seven days of receipt of a written request.
4	(8) Submit written request to the appropriate governing authority to have its
5	animal control agency produce public records pertaining to animal intake, adoption,
6	and euthanasia.
7	D. The task force shall act in an advisory capacity to the state veterinarian
8	and report activities periodically.
9	E.(1) Members of the task force shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing
10	authority.
11	(2) The task force shall meet at least once per calendar year. Additional
12	special or regular meetings may be held upon the call of the chairman.
13	(3) Task force members shall serve without compensation.
14	F. The department shall submit an annual report to the House and Senate
15	committees on Agriculture, Forestry, Aquaculture, and Rural Development no later
16	than February first of each year regarding the status of the animal control program
17	as provided for in this Section.
18	G. If the department does not receive the necessary funds, incurs a reduction
19	in funds, or receives insufficient monies to fund or continue the task force, the task
20	force shall become inactive.
21	§2366. Louisiana Animal Shelter Registry
22	A. The legislature finds that the establishment and maintenance of a
23	voluntary animal shelter registry will enable the Louisiana Animal Welfare
24	Commission Louisiana Animal Control Advisory Task Force to carry out its duties.
25	B. As used in this Section, the following terms are defined as follows: the
26	term
27	(1) "Commission" means the Louisiana Animal Welfare Commission.
28	(2) "Public animal shelter" "public animal shelter" means an animal shelter
29	owned, operated, or designated for the purpose of impoundment of animals by any
30	parish, municipality, or other subdivision of the state.

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1	C. The commission <u>state veterinarian</u> shall establish and maintain a registry
2	for animal shelters called the Louisiana Animal Shelter Registry.
3	D. On or before the first day of February of each calendar year, each parish
4	governing authority may submit to the commission state veterinarian a list of all
5	public animal shelters located within the parish's jurisdiction. The list shall include:

7	E. On or before the first day of February of each calendar year, each public
8	animal shelter may submit the following to the commission state veterinarian:
9	(1) The Basic Animal Data Matrix, submitted as "transparent" data, to the
10	Shelter Animals Count database found at http://www.shelteranimalscount.org. Public
11	animal shelters may submit the matrix electronically through this website or fill it out
12	manually and mail it to the commission, which will input the data on behalf of the
13	shelter.

15	Section 2. R.S. 47:120.71(section heading) and (A) are hereby amended and
16	reenacted to read as follows:
17	§120.71. Income tax checkoff; donation for Louisiana Animal Welfare Commission
18	Louisiana Pet Overpopulation Advisory Council; creation; use of monies
19	A. Every individual who files an individual income tax return for the current
20	tax year and who is entitled to a refund may designate on his current-year return that
21	all or any portion of the total amount of the refund to which he is entitled shall be
22	donated to the Louisiana Animal Welfare Commission Louisiana Pet Overpopulation
23	Advisory Council in lieu of that amount being paid to him as a refund, in which case
24	the refund shall be reduced by the amount so designated. The designation shall be
25	made at the time of the filing of the current-year tax return and shall be made upon
26	the income tax return form as provided by the secretary of the Department of
27	Revenue. No donation made under the provisions of this Subsection shall be invalid
28	for lack of an authentic act.
