JUDGES: (Constitutional Amendment) Provides relative to the holding of public office and public employment

A JOINT RESOLUTION

2 Proposing to amend Article V, Section 23(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana and to add 3 Article X, Section 31 of the Constitution of Louisiana, relative to public office and 4 public employment; to provide relative to the holding of public office or public 5 employment; to provide relative to age; to provide for the elimination of the 6 mandatory retirement age for judges; to provide for review of judicial candidates by 7 the Judiciary Commission; to provide for submission of the proposed amendments 8 to the electors; and to provide for related matters. 9 Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members 10 elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state of 11 Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to 12 amend Article V, Section 23(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows: 13 §23. Judges; Retirement 14 Section 23. 15 16 (B) Mandatory Retirement. Except as otherwise provided in this Section, a 17 judge shall not remain in office beyond his seventieth birthday. A judge who attains

1	seventy years of age while serving a term of office shall be allowed to complete that
2	term of office. The legislature may require a candidate for judicial office who has
3	attained the age of seventy years or who will attain the age of seventy years during
4	the term of office to submit to a review by the Judiciary Commission, as provided
5	by law.
6	Section 2. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members
7	elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state of
8	Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to add
9	Article X, Section 31 of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows:
10	§31. Public office or employment; age
11	Section 31. No person shall be denied the right to hold public office or public
12	employment based solely on age.
13	Section 3. Be it further resolved that this proposed amendment shall be submitted
14	to the electors of the state of Louisiana at the statewide election to be held on November 6,
15	2018.
16	Section 4. Be it further resolved that on the official ballot to be used at the election,
17	there shall be printed a proposition, upon which the electors of the state shall be permitted
18	to vote YES or NO, to amend the Constitution of Louisiana, which proposition shall read as
19	follows:
20	Do you support an amendment to prohibit the denial of the right to hold
21	public office or public employment based solely on age, including judges,
22	and to authorize a review by the Judiciary Commission of candidates for
23	judicial office who attain the age of seventy years? (Effective January 1,
24	2019) (Amends Article V, Section 23(B); Adds Article X, Section 31)

Abstract: Prohibits the denial of the right to hold public office or public employment based on age, provides for the removal of the mandatory retirement age for all judges, and authorizes the legislature to require judicial candidates reaching the age of 70 years to submit to a review by the Judiciary Commission.

<u>Present constitution</u> requires that no judge may remain in office beyond his 70th birthday. This provision allows a judge to complete the current term if he attains 70 years of age while in office.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> repeals the mandatory retirement age of judges and authorizes the submission of judges who reach the age of 70 years while in office to a review by the Judiciary Commission.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> provides that no person shall be denied the right to hold public office or public employment solely on account of age.

Provides for submission of the proposed amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held Nov. 6, 2018.
