7	Thomas H. Benton and Neva "Bootsie" Benton in Baton Rouge, Louisiana and was the third
8	of six children born to the couple; and
9	WHEREAS, Barrett Benton's mother, Neva, died while he was still a child, and in
10	1973 his father married Jodie Fulton Odom, and Barrett became the fifth of ten children, a
11	raucous and lively bunch; and
12	WHEREAS, Mr. Benton attended Louisiana State University, graduated in 1984,
13	and, like his father and grandfather before him, received a Juris Doctor from the Paul M.
14	Hebert Law Center in 1990; and
15	WHEREAS, Barrett Benton was briefly counsel to the Committee on Labor and
16	Industrial Relations of the Louisiana House of Representatives before joining his father at
17	the law firm of Benton, Benton & Associates; and
18	WHEREAS, Mr. Benton met his wife, Nadine Frick, while both were students at

2	campus; and
3	WHEREAS, three daughters and one son were born to Barrett Benton and Nadine,
4	and two grandchildren are expected in the near future; and
5	WHEREAS, Barrett Benton lived a full life filled with family, good friends,
6	traveling, dancing, storytelling, and making people laugh and, at his core, he was a Christian
7	deeply rooted in his faith; and
8	WHEREAS, Mr. Benton was a warm and loving person who opened his heart easily
9	to those who sought his attention, and his friendships were many; and
10	WHEREAS, Barrett Benton is survived by his wife of thirty-one years, Nadine, and
11	their children: daughters, Jessica Benton Milburn, Julia Benton Bueche, Emma Elizabeth
12	Benton, and son, Michael Benton; and
