The <u>proposed constitutional amendment</u> repeals all <u>present constitution provisions</u> relative to regular sessions convening in even-numbered years and all restrictions on the subject matter of items introduced or considered during a regular session. It further provides for submission of the proposed amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held on 11/6/2018.
